University Degree Requirements

- 1. Satisfactory completion of all requirements of the curriculum in which one is enrolled.
- 2. Earn a minimum total of 120 credits in approved coursework. Some academic programs exceed this minimum.
- 3. Satisfactory completion of the general education requirements as specified by the university.
- 4. A minimum institutional GPA of 2.00 based on work taken at NDSU.
- 5. At least 36 credits presented for graduation must be in courses numbered 300 or higher.
- 6. Transfer Students: Must earn a minimum of 60 credits from a baccalaureate-degree granting or professional institution.
 - a. Of these 60, at least 36 must be NDSU resident credits as defined in #7.
 - b. Within the 36 resident credits, a minimum of 15 must be in courses numbered 300 or higher and 15 credits in the major field of study.
- 7. At least 36 credits must be NDSU resident credits. Resident credits include credits registered and paid for at NDSU.
