University Degree Requirements

- 1. Satisfactory completion of all requirements of the curriculum in which one is enrolled.
- 2. Earn a minimum total of 120 credits in approved coursework. Some academic programs exceed this minimum.
- 3. Satisfactory completion of the general education requirements as specified by the university.
- 4. A minimum institutional GPA of 2.00 based on work taken at NDSU.
- 5. At least 30 credits must be NDSU resident credits. Resident credits include credits registered and paid for at NDSU.
- 6. At least 36 credits presented for graduation must be in courses numbered 300 or higher.
- 7. Students presenting transfer credit must meet the NDSU residence credits and the minimum upper level credit. Of the 30 credits earned in residence, a minimum of 15 semester credits must be in courses numbered 300 or above, and 15 semester credits must be in the student's curricula for their declared major.
